



# The biggest music video ever

- 1 On 21 December 2012, Gangnam Style, a music video by Korean musician Psy, became the first video in internet history to be watched by a billion people. This was such a high number that YouTube had to update its software to work with so many visitors. In May 2014, YouTube said that the video had two billion views another world record.
- The song is about Seoul's fashionable Gangnam area (often compared to Beverly Hills in California), and laughs at people who try to appear high class by saying they are 'Gangnam Style'. Psy laughs at them by singing oppan Gangnam style, saying he is 'Gangnam style' too.
